

Dr. Sigmund Loland is Professor of Sport Philosophy and Ethics at the Department of Cultural and Social Studies, Norwegian School of Sport Sciences (NSSS). He is also Guest Professor at The Swedish School of Sport and Health Sciences. Dr. Loland has published extensively on topics such as fairness and justice in sport, the ethics of performance-enhancing technologies, and Olympic philosophy and the ethics of Olympism. He has been a visiting scholar at several foreign institutions, including Stanford University (1993) and the University of Southern California (2014-2016). Dr. Loland has held a number of executive positions, among them Rector at NSSS (2005-13), Board member and President of the International Association for the Philosophy of Sport (IAPS) (2000-03), and of the European College of Sport Science (ECSS) (2006-13). Dr. Loland is a member of WADA's Ethics Panel (2004-) and of the Research Committee at IOC's Olympic Studies Centre (2013-). Dr. Loland has received a number of awards for his research and teaching, including IAPS Distinguished Scholar Award (2009) and NSSS Student Rose (2013). He is an International Fellow at the American Academy of Kinesiology and Physical Education (2004-). In 2017 he held an Olympic Chair (Guest Professorate) at the Universities of Leuven and Ghent, Belgium.
